Dear Friends of Greenleaf Family Center,

As I reflect on my first year as CEO, I am overwhelmed with gratitude for the incredible community that supports our mission of strengthening families and empowering individuals. This year has been a powerful testament to our collective strength, compassion, and commitment to serving the community.

2024 has been a year of both celebration and forward-thinking innovation. Our recent **Council on Accreditation (COA)** reaccreditation stands as a testament to deliver high-quality services. This recognition isn't just a milestone—it's a promise to our community that we continually strive for excellence.



We've made significant strides in critical areas that matter most. Our **Adolescent Suicide Prevention program** reached over 22,000 youth across 59 schools, extending mental health support even into summer months through innovative partnerships. The PEERS Program has expanded, serving 368 youth and their caregivers, providing more than 2,000 hours of peer support—a meaningful increase from the previous year.

Our commitment to the community doesn't stop there. The **Moms & Babies First** initiative hosted its first community Baby Shower and Trick or Treat event, reaching more than 445 attendees. We've also expanded our reach through a grant from Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities, providing enhanced case management services to **Deaf and Hard of Hearing clients** across five counties.

One of our most exciting developments is the establishment of the **Greenleaf Family Center Endowment Fund at Akron Community Foundation**. This fund ensures our ability to serve our community for generations to come. We welcome contributions of cash, bequests, stock, real estate, life insurance, and retirement assets—each gift an investment in our shared future.

Additionally, as we continue to look forward to the future stability of the organization, we're excited to share we will be launching our **strategic planning process** after the first of the year with completion expected by June 2025. The endowment fund and strategic planning efforts require collaboration and support to shape our future and deepen our impact.

As we prepare to welcome a new year, I am profoundly grateful for our supporters, volunteers, partners, and the families we serve. Your trust, dedication, and support make

our work possible.
