### Greenleaf's Prevention Program Partners with Local Organizations for Summer Activities

Over the summer, our Adolescent Suicide Prevention Program (ASPP) has shifted gears from school based programming to community based programming. Each week you will find staff at local **YMCA**s in Barberton and Nordonia delivering mental health focused curriculum to youth ranging in age from 5 - 12. We have double the fun in Barberton in July when we team up with other community-based partners through the **Barberton Community Wellness Collaborative** and provide 3 weeks of mental health programming for their *Summer Extravaganza*. We also recently added a new partnership in programming with **Safe Landing**, a crisis facility in Summit County, to provide biweekly suicide prevention education.

In addition to our community programming, ASPP has been partnering with our own KISSS and Moms and Babies First programs to attend the **AMHA** *Touch-a-Truck* events throughout Summit County and the inaugural *A Change of Art* for the **City of Green** in May. Some events on the horizon that we are looking forward to attending are *GeekFest* at the **Akron Public Library**, the *Stow Back 2 School Bash*, and *Magic Mayhem* in Barberton.
